Principal News

Welcome back – and to our new families – welcome to Moffatdale State School.

We hope that everyone managed to have a lovely break and enjoyed some time with their families.

It has been wonderful to see everyone arriving back, keen and eager to start the new year. Staff have been very busy arranging, organising and preparing for the new school year, and I believe that through conversations, everyone is having a wonderful start.

A massive shout out to Mr and Mrs Euler who have prepared our grounds and classrooms beautifully. With the amazing weather we have had, it is the first time in a long time that students can start the year with a green oval!

STAFFING

We have managed to maintain our 4 classes for this year.

In B Block, we have Miss Kingston and Mrs Hazelgrove who are working with our wonderful Prep/1 class. At the far end of their building, we now have a library! This is very exciting as our pre-existing library had to be turned into a classroom – so now students have a space during play times that they can come in to quietly read, play games or just keep out of the heat! A number of students have utilised this space already which is exciting.

In D Block we have the 2/3 class with Miss J and Mrs Chong, and the 3/4 class with Miss S and Mrs Kratzmann. On Wednesday's and Thursday's, Mrs Perry will be an additional aide who works between the two classes supporting students learning.

In C Block we have the 5/6 class with Miss Payne, Miss Clair and Mrs Lorkin. Miss Payne will be on class Monday, Thursday and Friday, with Miss Clair teaching Tuesday's and Wednesday's. Miss Clair is also based at Windaera 2 days a week and Cherbourg for the other day.

Since moving the library from the back of this space to the

far end of B Block, the classroom feels so different – and in a very positive way! Mrs Suchoronczak will be supporting students in the 5/6 and 3/4 space Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday's.

Our LOTE teacher this year remains the same. Sensei Piper will be here on Wednesday's, and as an added bonus, Sensei will provide Japanese cultural experiences to all grades in half hour sessions different weeks. 5/6 will be taught straight from the LOTE curriculum.

Mrs Goschnick, our PE teacher, will run her lessons on Monday's, beginning at 8:45am with the P/1 class.

Miss Bianca Moffatt is our Instrumental Music teacher. Miss Moffatt will be at Moffatdale Tuesday afternoons, working with our Instrumental music students. Miss Moffatt will officially begin her lessons in Week 3.

Mrs Kylie Plant is our Guidance Officer, and she will be here even weeks on Wednesday's, with her first day being Wednesday the 31st of January. If you would like your child to be seen by Mrs Plant, please come to the office and request a consent form.

Mrs Granger can be found up in A Block in the office. For any school enquiries, notes or payments, Mrs Granger is the lady in the know!

Miss Emma will continue to run our playgroup on Monday's from 9:00am to 10:30am.

We all look forward to a very exciting year ahead!

CURRICULUM

This year, teachers will be beginning to move to the new Version 9 of the Australian Curriculum in the areas of English and Maths. During the Student Free Days, teaching staff attending Professional Learning in Roma, looking closely at the English curriculum and identifying the changes between the previous curriculum and the newest version. We are all very keen to get involved in this, as 2025 is when it will become compulsory for all schools to move to this version for these learning strands.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Mrs Lorkin started Breakfast Club this week. We have some keen volunteers from our 5/6 class, but if there are any parents who are able to assist some mornings, please let Mrs Lorkin know. We have found breakfast club to be very popular and notice the difference when students have had a meal prior to entering the classrooms.

PARADE

This year we are trying something new with parade. On Mondays during first eating break, I will be speaking to the students about expectations for the week, any upcoming events they may need to be aware of and delivering any messages that students will need to know. Anything that families need to know, I will be placing either into the newsletters, or if families need to know a little sooner, either by letter, communicating through our Facebook page or through our SMS system.

On Friday from 2:20pm, we will have our celebration parade. This will be where our student leaders will run the parades, incorporating our school song, the anthem and handing out certificates. All families are invited to attend this parade, with the conclusion at 2:45pm in time for buses and pick up. We will post these awards onto our Facebook page too.

COMMUNICATION

We always aim to ensure families are in the know about what is happening at Moffatdale State School. To do this, we regularly update our Facebook page, will make phone contact, send home letters, email and use the student's communication books. If you would like to speak with a teacher, please contact the office to make an appointment or touch base with the teacher at appropriate times to arrange a time to meet.

SCHOOL REVIEW

In coming weeks, our school will have a review team visit to see how we are going. The aim of a review is to identify what it is that we are doing well and then make suggestions of how we can do things better or differently.

A review is a great opportunity for us to show people who might not be familiar with our context what makes our school a great school. As I find out more

information about this review, I will communicate it to all of our families.

SCHOOL UNIFORM AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS

Just a reminder that our school uniform is to be worn each day. Jewellery, make up and caps are not part of our school uniform. Toys and valuable items from home are not to be brought to school. We are not responsible for these items. If these items are brought to school, they will be taken to the office and parents will need to collect them.

PAUSE

In each of the classrooms, students will engage in Pause lessons. These lessons are a way for students to begin to understand their emotions.

The following dot points explain a little more about why we choose to do Pause lessons at

Moffatdale:

- **Pause** teaches students the importance of recognising the signals in their body that their brain sends them.
- **Pause** teaches the students the three key parts of the brain that are responsible for thinking, emotions and long term memory.
- **Pause** empowers students to self-regulate their own behaviour by taking notice and acting on the signals they receive from their brain in a positive way.
- **Wellbeing** underpins the way children feel about themselves and how they relate to others.
- **Pause** improves children's wellbeing by teaching them about neuroscience and mindfulness.

- ◆ And Maths & reading groups



I would like to introduce myself as your Guidance Officer for 2024. For the past 3 years I have worked as a Guidance Officer throughout different schools in the South Burnett region, and previous to this I was a classroom teacher. I have lived in the South Burnett region for the past 20 years and my children have all attended South Burnett schools, so I am excited to have the opportunity to work at Moffatdale Primary School this year.

Guidance Officers have a key role in your child's education. We advocate for your child, provide counselling, psychoeducational assessment and individual student support, as well as provide recommendations and advice to students, teachers and parents concerning educational, behavioural, mental health and family issues.



We do this by conducting activities such as student observation and psychoeducational assessment to determine the nature of students' learning difficulties, disability, developmental levels, or psychological and emotional status. This information helps us to make recommendations for educational adjustments and interventions.

This year, I will be visiting Moffatdale State Primary School once a fortnight on a Wednesday. Please ring the office if you would like to make a time to speak to me, or if you would like further information regarding the role of a Guidance Officer. Please also say hello to me if you see me during pick up or drop off times. I'm looking forward to getting to know the students at Moffatdale and their families!

WHAT IS A GUIDANCE OFFICER?



Guidance officers are specialist teachers who deliver a broad range of services to school community members. They contribute to the development of a comprehensive student support and wellbeing program that is responsive to the needs of the school community.

WHO CAN WORK WITH A GUIDANCE OFFICER?

Guidance officers may work directly with students in addition to working with a student's teachers, school support personnel, family, other specialists or external support providers.

WHAT TYPE OF SUPPORT IS AVAILABLE?

Support offered by guidance officers includes providing advice and counselling on educational, behavioural, vocational, personal, social, family, and mental health and wellbeing issues.



COUNSELLING

The Guidance Service at Moffatdale State Primary School is able to offer a counselling service to students.

Throughout their time at Primary School students may experience a number of challenges. This may include, but are not limited to:

- Friendship difficulties
- Difficulty managing emotions
- Self-esteem issues
- Mental Health Concerns

The Guidance Service at Moffatdale State Primary School is able to provide advice and support to address these types of concerns or issues. If further support is required the Guidance Officer is able to refer or advise regarding further counselling or support options.

PSYCHOEDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENT

A Guidance Officer is able to administer specialised psychoeducational assessments in order to further inform supports that may be required to support or extend students' learning.

The administration of such assessments is undertaken with the consent and collaboration of parents/carers, and at the discretion of the school team.



FAMILY SUPPORT

The Guidance Officer is able to provide support and advice to families who may require support to address a school related concern.

AVAILABILITY OF GUIDANCE SERVICES

The Guidance Officer visits Moffatdale State Primary School once a fortnight.

Prep / One Class

Welcome to the start of a new year! I hope everyone had a nice and relaxing break and is ready for another exciting year!

The Preps have had an amazing first week at 'big school' jumping straight into the routines and expectations of the classroom and school. The Year 1 students are doing a great job in helping and showing the Preppies what we do at school.

This term in English, the Preps are learning to retell an event and make connections to personal experiences within a preferred familiar story, and the Year 1's are learning to comprehend, orally retell, respond to questions and write in simple sentences about a familiar story. We are reading the books 'Little Red Hen', 'Little Red Riding Hood' and 'Silly Birds'. Students will read these books for a couple of weeks each, complete activities about the books and then students will pick their favourite to retell for their assessment.

This term in Maths, the Preps are learning to make connections between number names, numerals and position in a sequence, to copy and continue repeating patterns, to describe the position and location of themselves and objects in relation to other people and objects and to collect, sort and compare data. The Year 1's are learning to recognise, represent and order numbers, to create repeating patterns and identify the repeating unit, to give and follow directions to move people and objects around an obstacle course and to collect, record and represent data in a one-to-one display and compare and discuss data. Students will complete a range of rotations throughout the term to help with their understanding of these topics.

We will also be doing lots of other fun learning in Spelling, Handwriting, Reading, Science, Dance Cart, Digital Technology and this year students will have some exposure to Japanese cultural lessons.

Hello everyone and welcome to our new year of learning in the 2/3 space.

Concepts will present the opportunity for students to do learning in a variety of formats including online, hands on and written worksheets.

In Science students will explore how natural processes and human activity can cause changes to Earth's surface; erosion.



Miss Payne, Miss Clair, Mrs Lorkin

English: Our focus text this term will be 'Nanberry: Black Brother White' by Jackie French.

Students will review, discuss and comprehend aspects of a familiar narrative; and to create an alternative ending, developing and expanding on ideas, characters, settings and events.

PLD – students will engage in daily PLD Spelling and Dictation lessons that are targeting their levels of achievement. Testing will be completed by Week 9 so that students progress can be tracked and monitored, and new groups for the following term can be determined.

Daily **reading** lessons will occur. Students will be exposed to decodable texts, authentic texts and complete comprehension activities based around texts that they have been exposed to.

Maths: Three math concepts will be covered this term: Number/Space/Statistics

Number: Yr 5—write and order decimals (hundredths) and represent and order fractions. Yr 6: represent integers on a number line and order common fractions, giving reasons.

Space: Yr 5—perform and describe transformation of shapes, identify symmetries and use grid coordinates. Yr 6: locate and represent pairs on the Cartesian plane and create tessellating patterns using combinations of transformations.

Statistics: Yr 5—plan and conduct statistical investigations and compare distributions of data. Critique arguments presented in advertisements based on statistics. Yr 6: plan and conduct a statistical investigation and compare distributions of data. Critique arguments presented in advertisements based on statistics.

Science: Students will complete the unit 'Our Changing World'. In this unit, students will look at Natural Disasters – identifying what they are, why they occur, the impact they have on the Earth and ways we can minimise their impact.

HASS: Investigate how Australia became a federation; explore the three levels of government; and how citizenship rights have changed for different groups.

Health: Students describe their own and others' contributions to health and wellbeing. They access and interpret health information, and apply problem-solving skills to enhance their own and others' health and wellbeing.

Digital Technologies: Using the program Scratch, students will create a game that incorporates decision-making, repetition and user interface design into their designs and implement their digital solutions, including a visual program.


